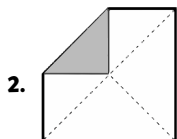
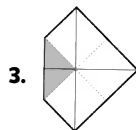


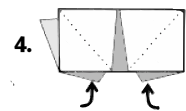
1. Text side face down, fold on both diagonal lines. Unfold.
